The administrations improved surveillance systems, facilitated institutional coordination, implemented policies towards building citizenship, and made urban modifications. He will talk about efforts aimed at reducing traffic-related injuries and violence-related injuries in the last 13 years in Bogotá and show the trends of violent deaths in the city compared to other areas of the country.
